The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints - Ireland A Religious Experience

Structure Tone's office in Ireland completed work on the Phoenix Park Meeting House for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints in conjunction with Houston Bell & Kennedy Architects. This project was the pilot in a series of projects to be completed under a partnering agreement between the Church and Structure Tone International. Built on a greenfield site, the project took 36 weeks to complete and consisted of a chapel with an 18-room teaching block, a fully-immersionable baptismal font, kitchen and toilet facilities as well as a large glazed foyer area and extensive site landscaping.

Our Dublin team is currently completing a second Meeting house for the Church in Portadown. This 7,500 square foot project is proving to be another successful project in a growing working relationship between Structure Tone and the Church. The Portadown Meeting house is an extensive refurbishment of a 1964 existing building and includes a retrofit of a new roof to the entire building with a complete upgrade of the curtain wall, ceilings, doors, floor finishes, specialist joinery, and mechanical and electrical installations to conform with new building control requirements. □

Bank of America - Dublin

Continuing on the great relationship that we have established with this client in the US, our Dublin team recently completed a project for Bank of America in Dublin City Centre. The Bank has leased a complete floor in one of Dublin's highest profile new buildings and contracted with an expert team that included Jones



Lang LaSalle, Burke Kennedy Doyle Architects and Structure Tone, to fit-out the shell and core.

The project started in the third quarter of last year with the appointment of the professional team and substantial completion was achieved early this year according to the schedule delineated on Day 1 of the program established with the client.

Coordination was the key to success on this project with the team working on a tight site with limited height access to the underground basement. This was further complicated by the fact that the site is enclosed on two sides by other buildings, with continuous LUAS works on the other two sides, which made material deliveries and the connection of telecommunications more difficult than usual.

The move into the building was seamless and Structure Tone wishes the client all the best in their new space. □



Hewlett Packard - Italy Italian Design is Re-Inventing HP Facilities

The Milan office of Structure Tone, has recently been awarded the management of all Design/Build projects for the HP-Compaq post-

merger in Italy and has successfully delivered the first area of the HP Italian Headquarters.

A completely new design was created by the Italian design firm, 967 Architecture which is working in partnership with Structure Tone's office in Italy on this project.

Building 78 of the HP campus was completely refurbished with particular design emphasis placed on the office and common areas. Design features included giant wall prints identifying common areas such as meeting rooms, copy machines, phone booths etc.

The next project on the same campus is Building 82, which encompasses a 30,000 square foot renovation. HP staff have been impressed with the new colorful image and look forward to Building 82 which is nearing completion. The buildings in Torino, Bologna, and Roma have also successfully been delivered to the client. □
